Media Statement October 27, 2021 Re: Abandoned Jaguar Cub

From Bobbi Brink, Founder and Director of Lions Tigers & Bears:

Lions Tigers & Bears is currently providing care for a four-month-old jaguar. The cub was abandoned, and is under the jurisdiction of California Department of Fish and Wildlife, who is conducting an investigation.

A lot of people are asking about the cub, who the sanctuary is calling Eddie. He is still a baby and requires round the clock care. The sanctuary is providing him with veterinary care and a comfortable, safe environment while this investigation unfolds.
